RESPONSIBILITIES

- Promotion of exceptional safeguarding practices at all times, including awareness or recording and reporting procedure in accordance with the Safeguarding Policy.
- To be responsible for the security of the premises in which activities are undertaken.
- To ensure that buildings and rooms are adequately secured upon departure through the use of door codes and locks.
- Create a warm, welcoming, and safe environment tailored to the needs of younger children.
- Meeting and greeting parents, signing children in at the start of the day and out at the end of the day.
- Accompanying children around the site to different activities, supervising lunch and supervising open play sessions.
- Support children with toileting, snack times, and transitions between activities.
